Program Information

The Cartoon Physics Show: Dive into the world of cartoons with this zany, interactive show. Meet the newest inductees to the spy team, and help them complete their mission. Watch cartoon characters defy the laws of gravity and survive impossible odds as we compare the physics of the cartoon world with the physics of the real world. Volunteers will be needed—so long as they don't mind having cartoon anvils dropped on their heads!

Spy Science: Our determined but somewhat fumbling cartoon spies have failed to complete their latest mission. Your group must complete The Franklin Institute's training course in the science of spying to help complete this mission. Collect evidence from a colorful crime scene, make your own spy gadget, and learn how to break secret cartoon spy codes to succeed where the cartoon spies have failed.

Feature Film in the Tuttleman IMAX Theater: Our giant-screen theater makes campers feel as if they were right in the action! Enjoy unobscured views. A 170-degree, four-an-a-half story domed screen surrounds our comfortable stadium seating. Add the magnificent sound of 56 directional speakers, and you are set for the ultimate movie-going experience. It's the best way to spend those last bursts of energy before campers bed-down in one of our amazing exhibits!

In the Fels Planetarium: Wake up with a view of the heavens, and join your fellow campers for The Search for Life: Are We Alone? Narrated by Harrison Ford, The Search for Life: Are We Alone? focuses on three relatively recent discoveries: life on Earth can survive in extreme, inhospitable environments; there are innumerable planets; and all planets are formed from the same cosmic processes. These findings suggest that life elsewhere in the universe may be more feasible than once imagined.

- Parking is available in the electronically-monitored garage under The Franklin Institute. The Camp-In discount rate of \$7.50 applies from 5:00PM until noon the following day (must have parking ticket validated at Camp-in).
- Scouts and parents should eat dinner before arriving. You may also purchase food from our in-house service or vending machines, or bring a packed meal. Breakfast will be provided.
